New Class of Drug treatment for **Diabetes and Obesity -**Rimonabant / Acomplia

A new class of drug, a Cannabinoid CB1 Receptor Antagonist, which can reduce weight, improve lipid profile and improve glycaemic control has been launched in the UK. Rimonabant (Brand name Acomplia) is indicated for use "as an adjunct to diet and exercise for treatment of Obese patients (BMI > 30), or overweight patients (BMI >27) with associated risk factors, such as type 2 diabetes or dyslipidaemia". Retinal Screening



The service is now up and running. Appointments are being sent out for 2-3 weeks following receipt of referral. If you have not received a result 8 weeks after the appointment, please contact us.
